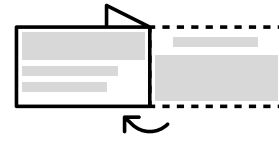




To print at home, use heavy weight paper, or card stock.
Cut out the cards along the dotted lines.



If you're unable to print on both sides, you can simply fold on the center line to make a 2-sided card.
